- You should monitor your own grades. It is very helpful to know your standing in the course at any time during the quarter. Course Procedures

Attendance

Punctual attendance is expected at all class sessions, *especially* on test days. If you participate in University sponsored activities (e.g., intercollegiate sports), you must inform your instructor ***before*** you are absent. Ohio University - Eastern policy regarding attendance will be followed. Students are responsible for all missed work. Since this class is only two weeks long, miss any class day is similar to missing an entire week of class. You cannot miss any days in this class and expect to perform well in the course.

Learning Activities

In-class learning activities must be submitted on time and **cannot** be made up at all.

Papers & Projects

Papers will be collected during the first ten minutes of class on the day they are due. After that time, they will be considered late. Late papers will have 5 points taken off per day they are late. Final projects will have 10 points taken off per day they are late, unless a documented excuse is attached when turned in to the graduate teaching assistant. If you know you will be absent prior to the date a paper or project is due, please turn your project in early.

Makeup Assignments and Examinations

If you miss an exam or other assignment, you must provide documentation to explain the absence in order to be considered for permission to make up the assignment. If you do not provide documentation for a missed test or assignment, you **cannot** make up that test or assignment. If you know that you will be forced to miss a day, please tell your instructor as far in advance as possible. Makeup examinations will be individual scheduled between the instructor and the student on an as needed basis.
